Welcome to St. Mark's Lutheran Church. God's compassion and mercy are for you.

We continue to read today from Luke 6 and Jesus' "Sermon on the Plain." In today's text Jesus urges "THE GOLDEN RULE" along with radical ethical generosity and extraordinary patterns of forgiveness in the hope that believers replicate these actions and attitudes. Contrast this to Jesus' "Sermon on the Mount" (Matthew 5-7, written about ten years after Luke). Luke and Matthew provide somewhat different versions of their common source. For example, Matthew's "Be perfect, as your heavenly Father is perfect" (5:48) is in Luke "Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful" (6:36). Recall that Luke's account of the crucifixion (23:34), not Matthew's, includes Jesus forgiving the soldiers. As you receive Christ's forgiveness this day, is there someone or something you also need to forgive?
