Merry Christmas! Thank you for your presence with St. Mark's! Today we read about Jesus' birth in Matthew's Christmas story! In the first two chapters of Matthew, so much happens at night: an angel appears to Joseph in a dream, the dark night sky makes the star over Bethlehem visible to the magi, and only a short time later Joseph is visited again in the night by an angel helping him protect his little family. In the quiet of night, in the shadowy parts of our story, and in the mysterious darkness of creation, there is surprising and amazing grace. Grace and new life are born in the dark. **December 21 (tonight!)** is the winter solstice, the longest night of the year. The early church in the Western hemisphere intentionally aligned its liturgical calendar with the movement of the planet, with the natural rhythms of light and darkness. After tonight, light will slowly creep back into each day, lengthening the daytime by seconds, then minutes, then hours . . . until the summer solstice on June 21, which is near when the church celebrates the feast of John the Baptist (June 24). May you be blessed with God's grace-filled presence in the dark of night and in the light of day!
